



HISTORIC BALTIMORE HOMES

Many of the homes in Baltimore are hundreds of years old and well known because of the people who once lived there, their unique architecture, or both. This tour points out just a few of the many historic homes of Baltimore.



TOUR INCLUDES

- ✓ **Evergreen House.** This beautiful mansion in North Baltimore was home to several generations of the Garrett family, who made their fortune in the B&O Railroad. It now houses a stunning collection of Tiffany Glass, hundreds of vintage books, and countless other works of fine art.
- ✓ **Babe Ruth Birthplace.** Baseball's greatest slugger was born in the second floor bedroom of this modest townhouse.

- ✓ **Homewood House (above).** This house was built by the son of Charles Carroll of Carrollton, Charles Carroll, Jr., or Charles Carroll of Homewood. It was donated to the university in 1902 along with the surrounding land.
- ✓ **Mount Clare Mansion.** This is one of the very first homes built in Baltimore and home to Charles Carroll the Barrister, a distant relative of Charles Carroll of Carrollton.
- ✓ **Edgar Allan Poe House (right).** The famous author only lived in this tiny house for 3 years, but it was here that he began focusing on writing prose instead of poetry.
