### TOUR INCLUDES

- ✓ **Orchard St. Church.** This church was founded by former slave Truman Pratt and is the current home of the Baltimore urban league.
- ✓ **President St. Station.** Henry "Box" Brown passed through here while famously escaping to the north packed inside a crate.
- ✓ **Eubie Blake National Museum and Cultural Center.** The jazz legend was born in Baltimore in 1887 and the center founded in his memory provides arts instruction for children and extensive musical theater and jazz performances.
- ✓ **Original site of the Royal Theater.** The stage at the Royal hosted the world's most popular jazz musicians during its heyday in 1920's. The theater was demolished in the 1970's and a monument was erected in its place.
- ✓ **Billie Holiday Park** was named after the soulful jazz singer, who was born in Baltimore.
- ✓ **Justice Thurgood Marshall** (above right), a Baltimore lawyer who successfully argued the landmark *Brown vs. Board of Education* before the Supreme Court. He would later become the first African American appointed to the highest court in the land.
- ✓ **Fells Point.** This is where legendary abolitionist and one-time slave Frederick Douglass (top) learned how to read and write. He would later become a close confidant of President Lincoln during the Civil War.
