

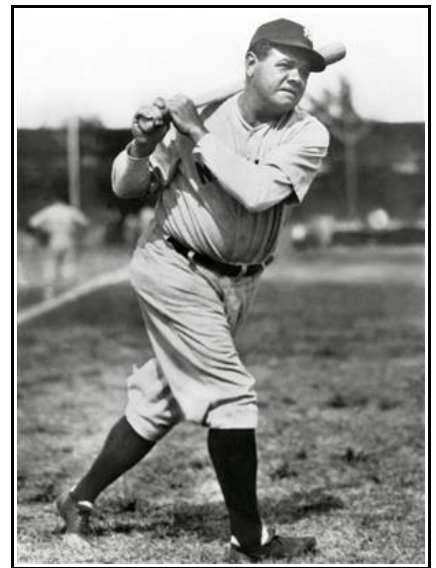


Baltimore – City of Champions!

Baltimore's sports heritage is long and illustrious. Babe Ruth, Cal Ripken, Jr., and even Seabiscuit all have important ties to the city. Hear about legends of the past and the stars of today on this memorable tour led by a professional guide! Available year round.

TOUR INCLUDES

- ✓ **Sports Legends Museum.** This amazing museum houses artifacts and memorabilia from all facets of Maryland sports history. Here you can see game used equipment from legendary players like Babe Ruth and Johnny Unitas and visit the Maryland Sports Hall of Fame.
- ✓ **Oriole Park at Camden Yards.** This often imitated, never duplicated ballpark opened its gates in 1992 and was the home of the 1993 All-Star Game. It's also where Cal Ripken, Jr. broke Lou Gehrig's streak of consecutive games when he played in his 2,131st game in September of 1995.
- ✓ **1st Mariner Arena.** The NBA's Baltimore Bullets played here from 1963 until 1973 when they moved to D.C. and were eventually renamed the Washington Wizards. Other past tenants include minor league hockey team Baltimore Skipjacks and indoor lacrosse team Baltimore Thunder.



- ✓ **Pimlico.** Home of the second jewel of horse racing's Triple Crown, the Preakness Stakes. Every May, well over 100,000 people pour through the gates to enjoy the historic race.
- ✓ **Babe Ruth Birthplace.** This row house was actually the home of the Babe's grandparents. A campaign in the 1960s saved the building from demolition and it now houses the Babe Ruth museum.
